## **“The Columbus Quincentenary as Turning Point in the Decolonization Struggle: A visit with Dr. Randy Woodley.”**

(Recorded September 12, 2017)

**Description:** This webinar commemorated the 25th Anniversary of the 1992 worldwide protests and explored the legacy of Indigenous activism that arose in its wake. Cherokee scholar and activist Dr Randy Woodley is Professor of Faith and Culture and Director of Intercultural and Indigenous Studies at Portland Seminary. He talked about his journey, his book *Shalom and the Community of Creation: An Indigenous Vision* (Eerdmans, 2012), as well as about a recent theological statement condemning White Supremacy he helped draft.

Later Ched shared about the impact of the Quincentenary on his past work, and Elaine about her more recent efforts to nurture Settler Response-ability and Restorative Solidarity.
